 to the Proprietors Use twenty Pounds within three months and the yearly Quitt<sup>t</sup>  
 of one Shilling Sterling P. hundred forever. These are to Authorize and Require  
 thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the sd Richd<sup>d</sup> Carter the said quantity  
 of three hundred Acres of Vacant Land between ye sd Creeks in such a manner  
 as may not incommode any further Settlement in the parts adjacent and make<sup>g</sup> Re-  
 turn thereof into the Secretaries Office. Which Survey in case the sd Richard fulfill  
 the Agreemt aforesd shall be valid otherwise to be void and of no effect as if it  
 had never been made nor this Warrt ever granted Given under our hands and  
 the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 22<sup>d</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> Month A.D.
