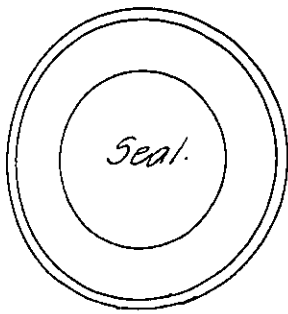

*At the Request of Bartholomew Coppock Junior for himself and his  
namesake B. C. Senior Purchasers of 750 Acres that I would grant them to take  
up three hundred and fifty Acres the Remainder of their said purchase untaken  
up— These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd unto  
them according to the method of Townships by me appointed the said number of  
three hundred and fifty acres of Land in this Province that has not been already  
Survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor is Seated by ye Indians and make  
returns thereof into my Secretaries Office w<sup>ch</sup> Survey being duly made & returned  
shall, if seated within six Months after be confirmed to him & his heirs for ever  
Given under my hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 4<sup>th</sup> of ye first month 170<sup>9</sup>.  
To Edward Perington Surveyor General Wm. Penn.  
of the Province of Pensilvania & Territories*

*Deduct twelve Acres for the Liberty land*
