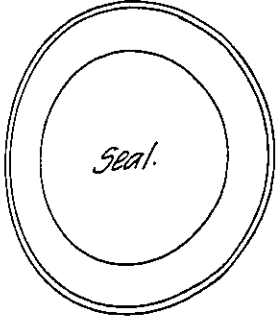

At the Request of Peter Collins of the County of Chester (by Ezekiel Harland) that we would grant him to take up two hundred Acres of Vacant Land in the forks of Brandywine in the said County for which he has agreed to pay to the Proprietor's Use on the 29th day of September next twenty pounds and the usual Yearly Quitrent of one English Shilling for each hundred Acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Survey-d to the said Peter Collins according to the Method of Townships appointed and adjourning to the Surveys in the said forks the said quantity of two hundred Acres of Vacant Land and make return thereof into the Secretaries Office. Which Survey in case the said Peter fulfill the Agreement aforesaid shall be valid otherwise the same shall be void and of no other effect than as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted.
