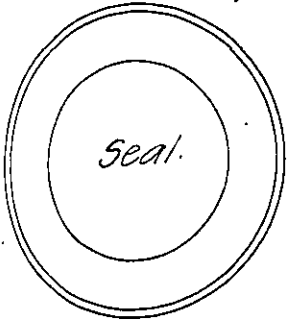


Pensylvania ps.*By the Commissioners of Property*

At the Request of George Carter late of Bucklebury in the County of Berks in Great Britain now of the County of Chester in this Province that we would grant him to take up two hundred and fifty acres of land in Right of William Bryant of Bucklebury aforesaid Original purchaser of the same of the Propriet^r by Indentures of Lease & Release bearing date the Twenty Ninth and Thirtieth days of November 1681 Who by like deeds bearing date the Twenty Sixth and Twenty Seventh days of April last sold & convey'd the said two Hundred and fifty Acres of Land to the said George Carter. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said George Carter according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of land in this Province that has been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Returne thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order to a further Confirmation. Given under our Hands and Seale of the Province at Philadelphia the fifteenth day of the Seventh Month Anno. Dom. 1714
