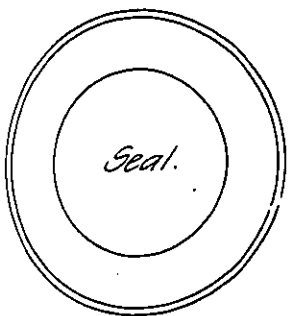


Pensilvania fo.*By the Commissioners of Property*

At the Request of Thomas Dawson of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up Three hundred acres of Land in the said County for w^{ch} he agrees to pay to the Propriet^{rs} use Thirty pounds for the whole and the usual yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd.

unto the said Thomas Dawson in the afores^d County of Chester near y^e Land Survey'd to Francis Worley or elsewhere at a sufficient distance from the Indians at Conestogoe According to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Three hundred acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secretaries Office which Survey in case the s^d Thomas fulfill the above Agreement within three months ~~if he do~~ shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever Granted. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 18th day of February A.D. 171⁶/₇
