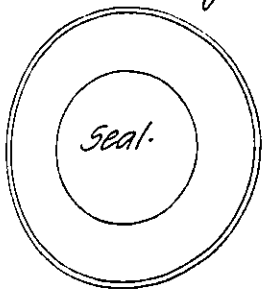


Pensilvania ꝑ.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Jenkin Davis late of Wales in Great Britain, <sup>but now of this Province</sup> that we would grant him to take up near or on the branches of Conestogo Creek One Thousand acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the use of the trustees of the Province One hundred pounds Money thereof One half now to be paid down and the remainder within six months after the date hereof and the yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred acres. These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Jenkin Davis at the place aforesaid according to the method of Townships appointed the said One thousand acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said Jenkin Davis fulfill the above agreement at ye times above prescribed shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted.
