



Pursuant to a warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated 16th of ye 12 mo 1701 I made a Reasurvey one a Certain tract of Land in the great vallee in the Welsh Tract in the County of Chester Reputed to belong to Balt: Rowles the which tract had not bin before exactly bounded but left as a vacancy between the the Line of David Jones Land and a tract of land laid out to Rachel Ellis in right of her Broth Humphry Ellis: the which vacancy proved to be 560 a. out of it was returned to Rowles 427 acres in order to answer his just demand and to satisfy the Commiss^{rs} for the rest or with it of according to regulation the said 427 acres extending from the Line A.B. to the ^{Line} C.D: the rest being from the Line C.D. to the Line E.F. Left in order to answer a Patent granted to ~~answre~~ Humphry Thomas the which Line E.F. was and is the bounds of the said Land in Right of Humphry Ellis and doth extend from the Line E.F. to ^{ye Line} G.H. being formerly surveyed to Rachel Ellis in right of her Brother afores^d and afterwards in pursuance of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated 18th day of the 12th mo 1701. Reasurveyed ^{it to her} ~~a warrant~~ about the 22^d of the Same mo: and by order of the Commiss^{rs} afores^d dated the 22^d of 11th mo 1706: one the 13th day of the 6 mo 1707 there was another Line being the Line I.K. that makes the Complmt of 500 acres between the Line A.B. being David Jones Line and the afores^d. I.K. as may appear by the distans set doune one the same here is above described the manner and form as it was at first and as it stands now. Leveing the ordering of the whol to the Commiss^{rs} of Prop^{ty} to regulate and order it as they think best and suppose Counting the whole. dated 15th 6 mo 1707
