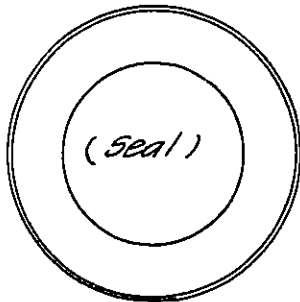

Whereas there is a certain tract of Land in Ridley Township in ye County of Chester Situate between Crum Creek Delaware River ye Land of ye Neals & John Sim-laid out for one hundred Acres cocks, equally claimed by Walter ffauoit & Edward Fritchett the bounds whereof are not yet sufficiently ascertained nor the limits adjusted between them. These therefore are to will and require thee forthwith to resurvey ~~resurvey~~ or cause to be resurveyed the sd Tract according to the true bounds and first Lines thereof.

Also to make an equal Partition of the sd Tract between the sd Walter & Edward-leaving unto each such Improvem<sup>ts</sup> and Conveniencies as they now stand possess'd of and make Returns of thy Resurvey into my Secretaries Office.
