These are to Authorize and Require thee to cause to be Survey'd & laid out to the said John le Dee three hundred Acres to the said Issac de Turk three hundred Acres and to John ffrederickfulls five hundred Acres of Land in the place afores that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up by any others nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Which Survey in case the said persons fulfill the Agreem's afores shall be valid, otherwise the same shall be altogether void & of no other effect than as if it had never been made nor this Warr ever granted.
