



By ye Commissioners impowred to grant Lotts
& Lands in ye Province of Pennsylvania & ye
Territories thereunto belonging.

At ye Request of Thomas Kirrll yt we would grant him to
take up a Spott or peece of a Lott beyond ye Swamp between
ye second & third Street, ^{from Delaware} containing about fifty foot front
or breadth, & about One hundred foot long. These are in ye
Proprietary's name to will & require thee forthwith to sur-
vey or cause to be survey'd unto him ye sd. Spott of Lote
provided it be clear & untaken up he seating it in and build-
ing upon ye same within six Months from ye Date of Survey
& make returns thereof into the Secretary's Office. Given
at Philadelphia ye 6th. ^{11th}/_{mo} 1684.
