

Pennsylvania 5.5.

In pursuance of a warrant dated the 13<sup>th</sup> day of Octr. 1760 locating and requiring Nicholas Scull Esqr. then Surveyor General to Survey for the Hon. Proprietaries all the Islands in the Rivers within the said Province wch. were purchased of the Indians. There was Surveyed unto them four Islands in the River Schuylkill in the County of Philada. the uppermost of wch. marked No. 1 Contains Forty perches of Land & is Opposite the Land of Hugh Roberts on the west side of the River & the Land of late of Isaac Norris leased to John Culp. One of them marked No. 2. Situate next below the above described Island Contains Seventy ~~one~~ perches of Land & is Situate Opposite the Land of Hugh Roberts on the west side & the Land of the late Isaac Norris leased as aforesd on the East side One other of them marked No 3. Contains One acre and three quarters and is Situate next below the last above described Island and is Opposite the Lands of Hugh Roberts & Christopher Robins on the west side & the Land of the late Isaac Norris Leased as aforesd on the East side The other of them marked No. 4. Contains One half of an acre and is Situate next below the last above described Island No 3 Opposite the Land of Christopher Robins on the west side and the land of Samuel Powel Esqr. on the East side of s<sup>d</sup> River. Returned into the Secretaries Office the 6<sup>th</sup> day of April. 1768.
