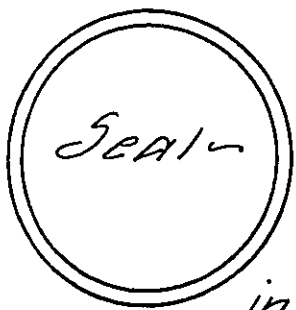


Pennsylvania s. s.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of William Lewis That we would Grant him to take up one hundred Acres of Land in this Province to be Holden <sup>under</sup> at the yearly Quitrent of one penny Sterling p acre. These are to Authorize and Re-quire thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto the Said William According to the Method of Townships Appointed the Said Quantity of one hundred Acres of ~~Vacant~~ Land in the Said Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up, Nor is Seated by the Indians And make a returne thereof into the Secretary's Office in Order to further Confirmation. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 27th. of the first Month 1714.
