thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him y<sup>e</sup> sd Number of Acres  
in y<sup>e</sup> aforementioned County, where not already taken up according to y<sup>e</sup> method  
of Townships appointed by me, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's  
Office. Given at Philadelphia, y<sup>e</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> October, 1683.
