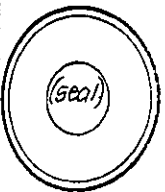

William Penn Absolute Proprietary and GovernE in  
Chief of the Province of Pensylvania and Counties Annexed.

In Pursuance of a General Warrant by me Granted to John Wilmore in  
England, for taking up three thousand Acres of Land in this Province: These are  
to require thee, according to the Settled Regulation for laying out of Lands in y<sup>e</sup> said  
Province, forthwith to Survey or cause to be survey'd to him the said John Wilmore  
Five hundred Acres ~~of Land~~ in part of the abovesaid three thousand Acres of  
Land not already taken up, Survey'd nor concealed, to be laid out according  
to y<sup>e</sup> Method of Townships by me appointed. He taking out a Patent for the  
same within three Months after Return shall be made thereof, into my  
secretaries Office, which thou art required to doe with all Convenient speed.  
Given under my Hand & Seal at Newcastle the first day of the Ninth Month 1700.
