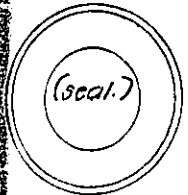


*Pensilvaniass.*

*By the Commissioners of Property.*



*At the Request of Robert Way That we would Grant him to take up one thousand acres of Land in this Province in one, two or three Tracts or parcels as he shall think fit, for which he hath agreed to pay to the Prop<sup>r</sup> use one hundred Pounds and the usual Quit rent of one Shilling Sterling for Each Hundred Acres  $\text{q}^{\text{d}}$  Annum*  
*----- These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd to the said Robert Way according to the Method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of one thousand Acres of Land in the said Province. Agreeable to his request in one two or three  $\text{p}^{\text{c}}$ ells that has not been Already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a returne thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order to a further Confirmation which Survey in Case the said Robert fulfill the aforesaid agreem<sup>t</sup> within three months after Location shall be Valid otherwise the Same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant <sup>ever</sup> Granted Given under our hands ~~and~~ and Seale of the Province at Philadelphia the 27th. of the first month, 1714:*
