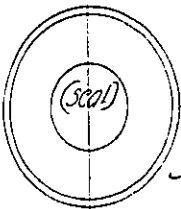


Pennsylvania, ss.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Thomas Wilson that we would Grant him to take up Seven Hundred and fifty four Acres of Land in Right of Charles Hartford Original Purchaser of One thousand Acres from the Proprietor to be laid out in this Province of which said purchase there hath been laid out to the said Charles Hartford two hundred and thirty six Acres soe that the said Seven Hundred and <sup>forty</sup> ~~fifty~~ four Acres Together with Twenty Acres for Liberty Land to be allow'd Compleats the said Purchase. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Thomas Wilson according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Seven Hundred and <sup>forty</sup> ~~fifty~~ four Acres of Land in the sd. Province that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by ye Indians and make a Returne thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order to a further Confirmation Given under our Hands and Seale of the Province at Philadel. the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> Month Anno Dni. 1714.
