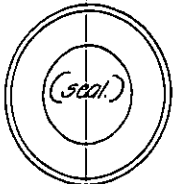


Pennsylvania ss.

By the Commissioners of Property.



At the Request of Richard Walker of the City of Philad^a, Cordwainer That we would Grant him to inclose one square of Ground Situate between Mulberry Street and High Street and between the Eleventh and Twelfth streets from ye River Delaware and that he may hold the same for the space of one and Twenty years next Ensuing the Date hereof for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Proprietary or Trustees of the Province Forty Shillings Sterling Money of Great Britain Yearly during the said Term and at the expiration thereof to Deliver up and Surrender the same under a good Fence and well improved. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and layout or cause to be Survey'd and laid out unto the said Richard Walker in the place aforesaid the said square of Ground to be by him held under ye said yearly rent of Forty Shillings Sterling which in case the said ~~Walker~~ Richard Yearly and duly fulfill and pay shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 30th day of October Anno Dni., 1719.
