By the Commissioners of Property.

Upon an agreement made with Peter Wents for about One Thousand acres of Land on a branch of the River Schuylkill called Sawcony, for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Proprietary Trustees Sixteen Pounds Money of this Province and the Yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred Acres... thereof. These are to authorize and Require thee to survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Peter Wents in one Regular Tract at the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of One Thousand acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said Peter Wents pay down one half of the Purchase Money in Gold or Silver and the Remainder within one year after the date hereof in the same Specie shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the first day of the Twelfth month Anno Dni. 1724/5.
