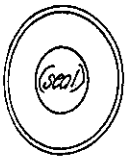

William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r in Chief
of the Province of Pensylvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Thomas Witters Agent for James Wallace of Bristol
Merch^t That I would grant him to take up five Hundred Acres of Land in right of
an old Purchase of one thousand Acres made by the said James Wallace in Eng-
land. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto
him y^e said J: Wallace the said Number of five hundred Acres of Land in this Province
not already survey'd taken up nor concealed, to be laid out after the Method of Town-
ships by me appointed, and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given
under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 28th day of the 10th Moth, 1700.
