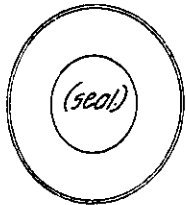

These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to Survey to the use of Joseph Willcox twenty seven foot in breadth of the Vacant Land adjoining on the North side of his Lot in the front street extended beyond the City and reaching from the said front to the second Street Also two other Lots in the third Street adjoining on the back ends of his second Street Lots to be held under the Yearly quitrent of two shillings Sterling and make Returns into the general Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where ~~the same~~ this Warrt is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands & Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 6th day of November, 1704. Edwd. Shippen.
