


William Penn Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> Province of Pennsilvania

At y<sup>e</sup> Request of James West, y<sup>e</sup> I would grant him to take up a Lott  
on Skulkill next to Paul Sanders, for conveniency of his Trade, being a Ship-  
wright: These are to will & require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be  
surveyd unto him a Lott, <sup>on ye other side of Skulkill seventy foot front on ye water.</sup> ~~convenient unto ye sd place~~, provided it be not  
taken up, he building upon it & fencing it in w<sup>th</sup>in one year after y<sup>e</sup> Date  
of Survey, and make returns thereof into my Secretarys Office Given at  
Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> mo. 1684.
