By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietary bearing date the 12th of the 7th mo. 1683 to me directed, I do hereby Certifie into the Secretaries Office That there was survey'd and laid out the 19th of the 5^d seventh month 1683 unto Joseph Wassey, Purchaser, a certain piece of lands situate lying and being in the Dublin Township and County of County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a Corner post of Walter Kings land Thence N.E. by the same four hundred and eighty perches From Thence S.E. by the Susquehanna^h Street or Road Eighty three perches & qu^{er} Thence S. W. by Robert Fairman's land four hundred and eighty perches From thence North west by a line of trees Eighty three perches and Qu^{er} to the place of Beginning, containing Two hundred and fifty acres of Land which is accordingly Entred & Recorded in the Surveyor Generals office at Philadelphia, the 24th 8th month, 1694.

By Virtue of a General Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing Date the 24th of the 12th month, 1702 for Resurveying of all the Lands, in the Township of Dublin, ⁱⁿ the County of Philadelphia from the Line of Philadelphia to the Outmost boundaries of the said Dublin Township. There was Resurvey in or about the first month in the Year 1703 a Tract of Land in the said Township of Dublin formerly Survey'd and Laid out to Joseph Wassey, the 19th day of the seventh month 1683 by Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietarie and Governour dated the Second of the 7th month 1683 for 251 acres of Beginning at a black Oak at the Corner of James Hultons Land and extending by the said Hultons land and the lands of Peter Taylor — Waterman, ^{ham} ~~Abraham~~ Pratt and Joseph Paul South west five hundred and thirty perches to a post at Joseph Pauls Corner Then North west Eighty perches to a post then north east by the line of Abington Township five hundred and thirty perches to a post Then south east seventy three perches to the Beginning containing two hundred and fifty three acres Resurvey'd of John Andrews.
