By vertue of a warrant from ye Proprietary & Gov^r, Bearing Date ye 18th of ye 11th moth, 1683 Directed to me, I hereby Certifie into his Secretary's Office y^t I have caused to be Surveyed and set out ye 1st of ye 1st moth Last unto John Wheeler in Right of James Harrison Purchaser of five Thousand acres his Lott in ye City of Philadelphia Scituated Between ye Walnut Street and Spruce Street containing in Length three hundred ninty six foot and in Breadth one hundred and two foot Bounded northward wth a Vacant Lott, Eastward wth ye Second Street from Delaw^e, Southward wth a Vacant Lott, Westward wth back Lotts, also one other peece or ~~cell~~ of Land Scituate Lying and Being in ye said City Before ye said Lott Between ye said Second Street and ye Swamp Containing in Breadth one hundred and two foot and in Length one hundred sixty five foot: Bounded northward wth a Vacant Lott Eastward wth ye Swamp Southward with a Vacant Lott and to ye Westward wth ye said Second Street from Delaw^e and is Accordingly Entered and Recorded in my office Philadelphia this 4th of ye 6th mo. 1684.
