At y<sup>e</sup> Request of John Wheeler, y<sup>t</sup> I would grant him to take up Thirty  
foot of Land in & before y<sup>e</sup> bank of y<sup>e</sup> River Delaware containing in breadth y<sup>e</sup>  
front of Enoch Flowers' Lott (w<sup>ch</sup> is thirty foot front) beginning upon y<sup>e</sup> Bounds  
of y<sup>e</sup> first Street upon y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> bank sixty foot distant from y<sup>e</sup> front of y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Lott,  
running out in length into y<sup>e</sup> River two hundred & fifty foot & no further, he  
makeing ~~according to~~ building according to Regulation: These are to will  
& require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup>  
Number of feet, & make Returns thereof into my Secretary's Office.  
Given at Philadelphia, y<sup>e</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> <sup>6<sup>th</sup></sup> mo., 1684.
