By vertue of a warrant from ye Com<sup>tes</sup> dated ye 20<sup>th</sup> of 9<sup>th</sup> 1692 directed to ye Survey<sup>r</sup> Generall. I do by Authority From him Certifie into ye Secretary's office that there was Surveyed and Laid out ye 22<sup>th</sup> of ye same m<sup>o</sup> unto Michell Walton A pece of Ground in ye Towne of Philadelphia Beginning at a forme post standing by Sassafras Street thence S. 72 E. by ye same 198 foot thence N. 18<sup>d</sup> E. 120 Foot y<sup>e</sup> S. 72 E by Jn<sup>e</sup> Howells Lott 198 Foot thence N 18<sup>d</sup> E. by ye second Street 482 Foot thence N 72<sup>d</sup> W. by Vine Street 396 Foot thence S. 18<sup>d</sup> W. 612 Foot to ye place of begining, which is accordingly Entred and Recorded in ye Survey<sup>r</sup> Generall's Office at Philadelphia ye 22<sup>d</sup> of 9<sup>th</sup>, 1692.

Note: that ye above mentioned Ground is only Leased to ye said Walton For twenty one years and on ye same Condition as ~~the other squares~~ oth<sup>rs</sup> have taken up ground in Squares in Philadelphia R<sup>t</sup>.
