Generall, bearing date ye 30th of ye 10th mo 1700 directed unto me I do hereby Certiefy into his Offic- that I have survey'd & Laid out unto John Willmor a Certaine tract of Land in the County of philladelphia beginneing at a corner post deviding it from a tract of Land Laid out for the propriatory Governours proper use from thenc-North East by a line of marked trees 500 perches to a black oak marked from thenc-North west by a Line of marked trees 160 perches to a post sett in ye ground from thenc-by vaccant Land south west 500 perches to a stake sett in ye ground from thenc-South East by a Line of marked trees 160 perches to ye place of beginneing Containeing and Laid out for five hundred acres of Land ye 14th of ye 11th mo Ensueing
