



William Penn Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> Province of Pennsylvania & y<sup>e</sup> Territories thereunto belonging.

At y<sup>e</sup> Request of Richard Wood Purchaser, y<sup>t</sup> I would grant him to take up next to y<sup>e</sup> Township of y<sup>e</sup> friends of Wales Five hundred Acres of Land in y<sup>e</sup> County of Philadelphia, These are to will & require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him y<sup>e</sup> sd number of Acres on Skunkill where not already taken up, according to y<sup>e</sup> method of Townships appointed by me, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 26<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>th</sup>, 1683.
