At y<sup>e</sup> Request of George Wood, Purchaser of one thousand Acres y<sup>t</sup> I would Grant him to take up his Proportion of Land win<sup>th</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Liberties of y<sup>e</sup> City, These are to will and require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto him Twenty Acres of Land win<sup>th</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Bounds thereof, according to y<sup>e</sup> method of Townships appointed by me, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 2<sup>d</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> m<sup>o</sup>, 1683.
