At y<sup>e</sup> Request of John West, Purchaser of One thousand Two hundred & fifty  
Acres, y<sup>e</sup> I would grant him to take up his Portion of Land w<sup>th</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Liberties  
of y<sup>e</sup> City: These are to will & require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to Survey or cause to be  
survey'd unto him Twenty five acres w<sup>th</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Bounds thereof on Skulkill, in a  
place not already taken up, according to y<sup>e</sup> method of Townships appoint-  
ed by me, and make returns thereof into my Secretary's Office. Given at  
Philadelphia, y<sup>e</sup> 14<sup>th</sup> mo. 4<sup>th</sup>, 1683.
