

By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 9<sup>th</sup> day of the 4<sup>th</sup> month 1702 for resurveying unto Wm. Watson a certain Tract of land Situate and laid out in New Bristol township in the County of Philadelphia for 500 acres (but should contain only 490 acres the proportion of liberty land being deducted) in right and as part of one thousand acres purchased by John Jones and Michael Jones of Bristol.

Resurvey'd the 9<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>mo</sup> 1702. to the <sup>sd</sup> William Watson the said Tract of land beginning at a hickery Sapling and running by the line of John Gennets land north east four hundred and ~~eight~~ eighty perches to another hickery Sapling Then south East one hundred eighty perches to a black oak Thence south west four hundred and Eighty perches to a post Thence North west one hundred eighty six perches to the beginning Containing five hundred and fifty eight acres. Resurvey'd by David Pawel and Returned into the General Surveyors Office the 17<sup>th</sup> of the 9<sup>th</sup>, 1703.
