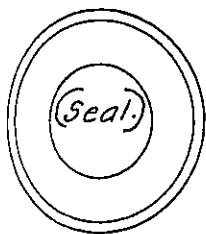


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of John Farrer late of East Jersey that we would grant him to take up four hundred Acres of Land on the Southside of Conestogoe Creek, for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use forty Pounds in the whole, and the yearly Quittrent of one shilling Sterling for each hundred Acres for ever: These are to Authorize thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the said John Farrer according to the method of Townships the said quantity of four hundred Acres of Vacant Land & situate as aforesaid and make a return thereof into the Secretaries Office in order to a further confirmation in case the said John ^{shall} within three months after the date hereof fulfill y^e Agreement aforesd in paying the s^d Consideration Money. But upon failure thereof thy said Survey with this Warrt is to be void and of no other effect than as if the same had never been made nor granted. Given under our hands & Seal of the Province at Philad^a the 22^d day of the 6th moth A.D. 1716.
