These are therefor in the Proprietary's Name to will and require thee Forthwith to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto him the said Numbe<sup>r</sup> of acres in the aforesaid County where not already taken up, according to the method of Townships appointed by the Govern<sup>rs</sup>, he seating and Improveing the same within Six Months after the Date of Survey and make returne hereof to the Secr<sup>y</sup> Office. Dated at Philadelphia the 12<sup>th</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> mon<sup>th</sup> 1686.
