for Purchasers of y<sup>e</sup> like Quantity & make Returns thereof into my  
Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 15<sup>th</sup> <sup>mo.</sup> 4<sup>th</sup>, 1683.
