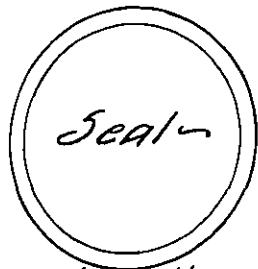


Pensylvania 5.5.



By the Commissioners of Property.  
 At the request of James Steel that we would Grant him to take up in ye Liberties of the City Philadelphia the proportions of Liberty Land belonging to five hundred Acres purchased of ye Propr by Thomas Dell and two hundred & fifty Acres purchased by Robert Stevens and two hundred and fifty acres purchased by William Bryant The right to the said proportions being now vested in the said James Steel. These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey & lay out or cause to be Survey'd and laid out unto the said James Steel in the said Liberties [if there to be found vacant] the said proportions of Land [viz] Sixteen Acres in the whole if on this Side of the River Schuylkill or Twenty acres on the other side of ye said River and make Returns thereof into ye Secretarys Office in order for a further confirmation. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia ye 10th day of the second Month Anno Dni 1718.
