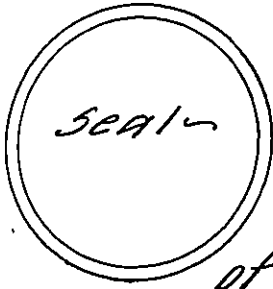


Pennsylvania 5.5.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Jeremiah Hopton of Shaker-  
maxen that we would Grant him to take up a lot  
of Ground in the City of Philadelphia appurtenant  
& belonging to Two hundred and fifty acres of Land.  
Granted by the Proprietor by Deeds of Lease & Release  
dated ye 10th & 11th days of October 1681. to Richard Jordain  
of London who by like Deeds dated ye 25th & 26th days of  
the Month called April, 1684. Granted the same to Edwd.  
Hopton ffather of the said Jeremiah who bequeathed the  
said Lot to him. These are to authorize and Require thee to  
Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the <sup>said</sup> Jeremiah Hopton in  
the said City. the said Lot of Ground where the same fell  
by allotment or as near thereunto as may be and make  
Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a  
further Confirmation. Given under our hands and the seal  
of the Province at Philad. ye 15th day of X<sup>br.</sup> a Dni. 1719  
To Jacob Taylor Surveyr. General. Richd. Hill.
