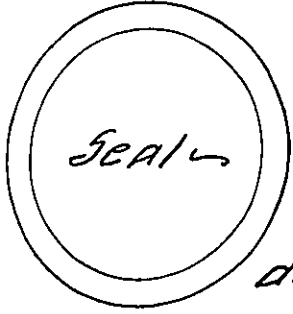


Pensylvania. S. S.

Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philada. the 19th day of ye 9th moth. A. D. 1716.
