



November the 9th 1730 Surveyd and Layd out for James Steel of the City of Philadelphia Gent a Tract of Land on a branch of Octararoe in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a white Oak marked for a Corner Thence by a line of marked trees East twenty six perches to another white Oak Then south by a line of marked trees one hundred fifty eight perches to a third white Oak. Then west by a line of trees two hundred and twenty pches. Then North by a line of Marked trees one hundred and ten perches. Then by a Line of marked trees East thirty four perches Then North by a line of Marked trees One hundred and six perches. Then by a line of mark trees East one hundred and sixty perches Then by a line of marked trees South fifty eight perches to the place of beginning containing two hundred and fifty acres with allowance of six p Cent. One hundred acres thereof in Right of William Bacon by a Warrant from the Commissr of Property dated the 21st day of December 1722 and one hundred and fifty in Right of William Markham.
