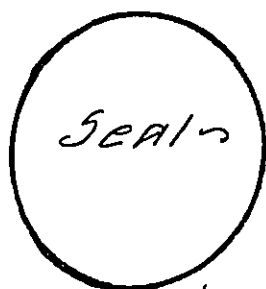


Pennsylvania S. S.

Trouble and expence in your Journey to Mack-  
hackamack and Cashetang on the branches of  
Delaware River and for Satisfaction for the Same.

These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause  
to be Survey'd unto the said James Steel and thy Self  
among the late Surveys made back in the Province according  
to the Method of Townships appointed the quantity of  
Four Hundred Acres of Land that has not been already  
Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians.  
To be holden of the Propr. under the yearly quitrent of  
one Shilling Sterling for each hundred Acres and make  
returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for  
a further Confirmation Given under our hands and the  
Seal of the Province at Philadelphia ye 10th day of  
December Anno Dni. 1719.
