 Being Sick of Body & in a decaying Condition & Expecting that it will  
 please God to make an End of my days I therefore do make  
 this disposition of my Effects. viz. after what manner the same  
 shall be administred & divided Between my wife and the Girl  
 which we took unto us & did bring up Impris it is my will that my  
 wife shall after paying of my Debts have and Enjoy the one third  
 part of my Estate and shall moreover be and remain in the poss-  
 ession & Enjoyment of my Estate during her Natural Life if she  
 behaves well and may dispose of her thirds as she thinks fitt  
 and Eva Scheuerin shall have the remainder Two thirds of  
 my Estate with this Proviso that the Sum of ffifty pounds out  
 of the sd two thirds shall be pd. unto the Lutheran Church at  
 the Trap and furthermore it is my will that there shall be no  
 more Land cleared upon the Plantation but one Acre for sowing  
 of Turnips by the Barren and I do Nominate & appoint my  
 sd. wife and John Nicholas Gressman to be Exrs. of this my will.  
 the same shall sell at a Vendue the one Plantacon vizt of 100  
 acres of Land & pay the Debts lowe. This is what I Jacob Nus  
 being of perfect Memory in presence of witnesses declare  
 to be my will Jacob Nuss, witnesses Michael Ness, Peter  
 Schneider, John Peter Hesse.
