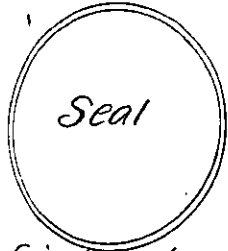


Pensilvania

Whereas there was formerly laid out unto Robert ffairman five hundred Acres of Land in Dublin Township in the County of Philad<sup>ia</sup> in right of W<sup>m</sup> Puryor his Original Purchase of One thousand Acres Parcel of W<sup>ch</sup> Tract Thomas ffairman Constituted Attorney to his brother y<sup>e</sup> Rob<sup>t</sup> Sold and Conveyd One hundred Acres to Richard Willington from Whom by Sundry mesne Conveyances the S<sup>d</sup> hundred Acres is derived unto Joseph Paul of the Said County & now in his Possession, Who Requesting a Resurvey upon the Same, These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith exactly to Resurvey not only the S<sup>d</sup> whole Tract of five hundred Acres according to the true bounds thereof & original Lines of Survey, but also particularly the Said Parcel purchased by the S<sup>d</sup> Joseph for One hundred Acres, according to the true Lines by W<sup>ch</sup> it was Subdivided, together with Such other Lands adjoyning & belonging to the S<sup>d</sup> Joseph as he Shall direct and make particular Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by y<sup>e</sup> Secretary, Given under our hands & Seal of y<sup>e</sup> Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> 13<sup>th</sup> 2<sup>mo</sup> 1703
