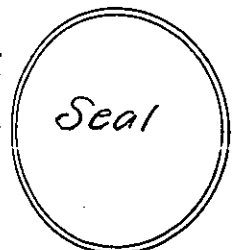


William Penn Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> of ye Province of Pennsylvania

unto him ye sd. Number of Acres in ye aforementioned County Where  
not already taken up according to ye Method of Townships appointed  
by me, he Seating & improving ye Same w<sup>th</sup>in One Year from ye  
Date of Survey & make returns thereof into my Secretarys Office.

Given at Philadelphia ye 25<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> mo 1684.
