



Pursuant to a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property I Surveyd to Charles Brockden a Certain Tract or parcel of Land Situate in the County of Chester,  
 Begining at a marked White Oak Standing at the foot of a Barren Hill on the East Side of the main Branch of a run (being a Branch of Octararoe Creek) Comonly called Hog Run Thence South East by Vacant Land 122 perches to a black Oak thence East by North by Vacant Land 194 pches to a post thence North West by Vacant Land 230 1/2 pches to a Small White Oak thence South West by Vacant Land 160 3/4 — to the place of Begining Containing One Hundred and Sixty Eight acres with the allowance of Six p Cent.
