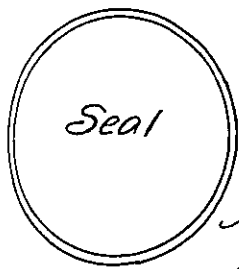


Pensylvania S.S.

By the Commissioners of Property



At the Request of Isaac Penington that we would Grant him to take up the Quantity of ffive Hundred Acres of Land in this Province the Original purchase of Tho^s Ellwood made of the late Proprietor by Deeds of Lease & Release dated 17th & 18th dayes of October Anno 1681 Whoby his last Will & Testament dated ye 21st day of the Month called Augst 1712. Did Give & bequeath the Same unto the said Isaac Penington his heirs & Assignes forever. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyd unto ye said Isaac Penington in the Said Province according to the Method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of ffive hundred Acres of Land (The Proportion of Liberty Land being first Deducted) that has not been already Surveyd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returnes thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation.

Given under our hands and the lesser Seal of ye Province at Philadelphia the 20th day of the Third Month Anno Din 1725,
