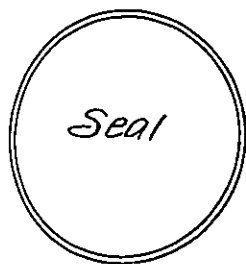


Pensilvania S.S.
