

Pennsylvania 5.5. In pursuance of a warrant dated the 13th day of October 1760 requiring Nicholas Scull then Surveyor General al to Survey for the use of the Honble. Proprietaries all the Islands in the River Delaware, Schuykill & Susquehanna and all other Rivers and Creeks in the said Province purchased from the Indians. I do hereby Certify that I have caused to be Surveyed on the 7th of August 1769 for their Use an Island in the River Susquehanna Called Round Island partly opposite the Mouth of Canary ^{CONOY} Creek in Donegall Township Lancaster County Beginning at the upper point thence down the same South Ten Degrees East twenty one perches South twenty degrees East fifty four perches, South East twenty nine perches to the lower point of sd Island, thence up the other side North Seven degrees west fifty Six perches, North twenty degrees west twenty Seven perches, and North Sixty nine Degrees west twenty nine perches to the place of Beginning Containing Ten Acres and Allowance of 6p Cent & ca. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 12th day of October 1770.
