Pursuant to a War<sup>t</sup> dated the fifth day of ye 6<sup>th</sup> M<sup>o</sup> 1713, Surveyd the above tract of Land in the County of Philadelphia, begining at a Corner post of James Dickason's Land, from thenc\_ by a Line of marked trees by reputed Vacct Land N: West 720 perches to a post neere a Hickry marked for a Course by the North East branch of Perkiomia, then by the Sevral Courses of the Same 100 perches to Ash marked by the Branch, thenc\_ S: West 110 perches to a Stake set in the ground for a Corner, then by a Line of marked trees and Reputed Vacct Land S: East 720 perches to a Stake in the Said James Dickason's Line - then by ditto N: East to the first place of begining Containing 893 acres: with 6<sup>pt</sup> Cent for Roads Surveyd 22<sup>d</sup> 3<sup>m</sup> 1713, 1714
