These are to authorize and require you to Survey and lay out or cause to be Surveyed and laid out for our Use the quantity of Five Hundred Acres of Land on the South Side of Shamokin Creek joining the line of the Proprietary Survey lately made by William Scull and likewise five hundred Acres more at the point of the West Branch on the North Side running up said Branch unto a Small Creek, then Northerly to the foot of the Mountain then Easterly along the Sd Mountain unto the place of beginning, and to make Return thereof into our Secretarys Office And for so doing this shall be your Sufficient Warrant.

Witness John Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> Lieutenant Governor & Commissioner of Property of the S<sup>d</sup> province who by virtue of certain powers from the S<sup>d</sup> prop<sup>rs</sup> hath hereunto set his Hand & caused the Seal of the Land Office to be affixed at philad<sup>a</sup> this fifth Day of January One thousand Seven hundred & Sixty nine.
