 Surveyed and laid out for our Use the Quantity of One Thousand Acres of
 Viz Five Hundred Acres thereof at the Mouth of a Creek Known by the name of
 Laycaming and Extending thence down and upon the River Sasquehanna
 and the other Five Hundred Acres in any part of the Purchase lately made
 at Fort Stanwix of the Six Nations that Shall not interfere with any former
 Warrants and to make Returns of the Same into our Secretarys Office,
 And for so doing this Shall be your Sufficient Warrant. Witness John
 Penn Esq^r Lieutenant Governor and Commissioner of Property of the
 Said province who by Virtue of Certain powers from the Said Proprietaries
 hath hereunto set his Hand and caused the Seal of the Land Office to be
 affixed at Philadelphia this thirty first Day of January One
 Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Nine
