

Pennsylvania 5.5.

In pursuance of a warrant dated the 13th day of Octr. 1760. requiring Nicholas Scull then Surveyor General to Survey or cause to be Surveyed for the Honble Proprietaries all the Islands in the Different Rivers & Creeks in the said Province purchased of the Indians. I do hereby certify that there was Surveyed for them two Certain Islands situate at the Conflux of the Rivers Susquehanna & Juniata the Largest of them Begins at the Lowermost point at the Grand Junction of the Rivers thence up the River Juniata to its Junction ^{with} ~~at~~ a part of the Susquehanna Five hundred & seventy six perches thence down the said part to the place of Beginning Containing Three Hundred & five acres & a half & allowance of 6 pct. The other Island situate above the one described being surrounded by the waters of the said part of Susquehanna & Contains Twenty two acres & allowance of 6 pct & ca. Returned into the Secretaries Office the 7th. Day of April, 1768.
