Richard Crosby in whose possession the ~~sd~~ remaining
80 Acres now is or lately has been, and make Distinct Returne
of the s^d Tract reputed to contain 200 Acres into the General
Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warr^t is to re-
main and a Copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by
